CAN - Ability

The modal verb can is used in a variety of ways. Below are brief explanations of usage along with an exercise for you to check your understanding.

Generally, we should know that can is used to express ability or absence of ability.

```
I can read = I am able to read. (I have the ability)
I can't fly = I am unable to fly. (I don't have the ability)
```

Can is the same for all subjects. We don't add an 'S' in the third person (like other verbs)

The verb that comes after **Can** is in the infinitive without **to**:

- I **can** *speak* Spanish. (= it is possible for me to speak Spanish = I have the ability to speak Spanish)
- He can swim well.
- We can see our neighbour in the garden.
- They can play the guitar.

Negative

To form the negative we add "**not**" after **can** to form one word: **cannot**. We can also contract the negative to form **can't.** (can't = cannot)

- I cannot play the piano. We can't go to the cinema tonight.
- She **cannot** *speak* French very well. He **can't** *drive* a car.

Questions

To from the question we change the position of the subject and the auxiliary verb. The main verb is still in the infinitive without *to*.

- Where can I buy an ice-cream?
- Can I go to the party, please?
- Can you speak Japanese?
- What **can** we *do* on Saturday?

Remember that you can use short answers:

- Can I sit here please? Yes, you can.
- Can you speak Chinese? No, I can't.
